

# Strategy Development

A collaborative process grounded in Participatory
Action Research and Community Development
Principles.

- Scoping review of literature on the role of Neighbourhood Centres in bushfires.
- > Through phone, online consultation and survey, participants shared their knowledge and experience of supporting bushfire-affected communities.

> Regular online consultations, including a presentation of the thematic findings from phone conversations and survey, facilitated the process of developing, reviewing, and refining the five strategic priorities.

Neighbourhood Centres reviewed the working drafts of the Strategy; feedback was implemented into the finalised Strategy





# Key findings


Neighbourhood Centres are wellplaced to support their community to plan and prepare for bushfires.

The key role that Neighbourhood Centres can play in the response phase is to provide information and referral for affected individuals.

Neighbourhood Centres have the greatest capacity in the recovery phase and are invested in helping communities recover from bushfires.





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### Neighbourhood Centre Disaster Resilience Strategy Project

Neighbourhood Centres are playing a crucial role across the state in responding to natural disasters using community-led initiatives. The Queensland Families and Communities Association is developing a Queensland-wide Disaster Resilience Strategy with the Neighbourhood Centre sector by researching, analysing and using participatory methods to further develop and enhance this work. The Strategy will comprise of three distinct sub-strategies focused on drought, monsoon and bushfire. These strategies will be used as research and strategy frameworks for their respective regions while being aggregated into a Queensland-wide strategy for Neighbourhood Centres across the state.
